#### **Details**

Your \$800 donation (\$300 for schools and educational groups) covers the costs of materials and supervision for one Team Build day. Here's what you need to know:

- Groups may recruit up to 8 volunteers to build. For an additional donation, we may be able to accommodate larger groups, depending on the stage of construction
- Schedule 1-3 months in advance, subject to date availability
- 7-hour (9:00am to 4:00pm) workday, volunteers are requested to make a full-day commitment
- · Habitat T-shirt for all builders
- · Bring your own lunch
- Your donation is fully tax-deductible. Pioneer Valley Habitat for Humanity is an official 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.

No previous construction skills are needed. Pioneer Valley Habitat for Humanity will provide skilled construction staff to train volunteers and supervise construction. All tools, safety equipment, and building materials needed for build days will be provided.

Imagine how you might transform the group dynamics of your organization or business with a day helping a family with low income become first time homeowners: covered in dirt and drywall dust, tools in hand, your team can expect an experience that will enable them to get to know each other in ways that conference room training sessions simply can't offer. Habitat Team Build participants are not only touched on a personal level by volunteering but also find that working with colleagues on the Habitat work site can make a difference in the way teams work together back at the office on a daily basis. As you take part in creating stability for a family, your team's stability will mirror that same transformation.
